Healthy Start

Area: UK

Support offered:

Free food and vitamins.

How to access this service:

Healthy Start provides vouchers for any woman who is pregnant or had children under four to spend on milk, fresh and frozen fruit and vegetables, and infant formula milk. You can also get free vitamins.

You qualify for Healthy Start if you're at least 10 weeks pregnant or have a children under four years old **and** you or your family get on or more of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (with a family income of £16,190 or less per year)
- Universal Credit (with a family take home pay of £408 or less per month)

Project 17


Area: London

Support offered: Project 17 works to end destitution among migrant children. They work with families experiencing exceptional poverty to improve their access to local authority support. If you are a migrant, they may be able to help you with access to housing and other basic needs.

PramDepot

Area: North London

Support offered: Free Baby Boxes containing all the essentials a woman and her baby needs for the first three months of the baby's life. The boxes contain items such as nappies, wipes, cream, soap, maternity and breast pads, a mattress, sheets, blankets, muslins, sling and breast pump, steriliser and recycled baby clothes and equipment, as well as toiletries for mums.

How to access this service: You will need another organisation to refer you to PramDepot. If you don't have another organisation who can refer you, you can contact Birth Companions who may be able to do this.
