PROBLEM ADDRESSED

FRAGMENTED COMMUNITIES, FOOD SECURITY, URBAN BIODIVERSITY

ASF returned to Chelsea in 2012 to lead the Urban Green exhibit, targeted at promoting the concept of linking ecosystems and social systems; facilitating and empowering individuals and communities to better understand and improve their own environments.

Through the exhibition individuals were able to gain knowledge and practical ideas (tools), as well as the very seeds they need to start transforming the wasted spaces within their urban environments.

ASF worked with Chelsea Fringe, Roots and Shoots, Cripley Meadow Allotments (Oxford), FoE, Secret Seeds Society, Bill Flowers, Pimp your Pavements, Edible Bus Stops, River of Flowers, and more.

GOAL ACHIEVED

The exhibit engaged with at least 2,000 visitors of the RHS Chelsea Flower Show 2012 demonstrating the empowering benefit to communities which can result from encouraging greater horticulture and agriculture within urban environments. ASF-UK was awarded a Silver Lindley medal and built partnerships with local groups.
