

Categories and Judging Criteria

The BAPM awards recognise outstanding contributions in perinatal care. We want to hear about teams and individuals that have gone above and beyond in big and small ways. We want to recognise the people that stand out from the crowd because they go out of their way to make things better for their patients and colleagues.

Entries that cover the following topics are welcome but applications covering any work relating to perinatal care will be accepted.

- Quality Improvement
- Family Integrated Care
- Equality and Diversity
- Multidisciplinary Team Working
- Improving wellbeing for colleagues and / or families

Category 1: Best National /Regional Project

An award for a project that has made an outstanding contribution to perinatal care on a regional or national scale.

Judging criteria

- How creative/innovative is the initiative?
- Has the project demonstrated measurable improvement to patient care?
- What level of obstacles have been overcome to get the initiative up and running?
- How well was the project communicated to ensure buy-in?
- How sustainable is the project?

Category 2: Best Local Project

An award for a project that has made an outstanding contribution to perinatal care in a local area (individual units or trusts).

Judging criteria

- How creative/innovative is the initiative?
- Has the project demonstrated measurable improvement to patient care?
- What level of obstacles have been overcome to get the initiative up and running?
- How well was the project communicated to ensure buy-in?
- How sustainable is the project?

Category 3: Outstanding Team

An award for a team that has made an outstanding contribution to perinatal care in the last 12 months.

Judging Criteria

- How well has the team demonstrated measurable achievements?
- How much does the team's work impact on patient care?
- How much have the team gone above and beyond their normal duties?
- How well have the team communicated their work to others?
- How well has the team demonstrated effective collaboration?

Category 4: Outstanding Individual

An award for an individual that has made an outstanding contribution to perinatal care in the last 12 months.

Judging Criteria

- How well has the individual demonstrated measurable achievements?
- How much does the individual's work impact on patient care?
- How much has the individual gone above and beyond their normal duties?
- How much has the individual collaborated with others?
- How well has the individual demonstrated leadership skills?

Category 5: Outstanding contribution to BAPM

An award for one or more individuals that have made an outstanding contribution to BAPM's work programme in the last 12 months. The following awards may be given:

- Outstanding contribution to BAPM by a consultant
- Outstanding contribution to BAPM by a Trainee
- Outstanding contribution to BAPM by a Nurse, ANNP or Midwife
- Outstanding contribution to BAPM by an AHP

Judging Criteria

- How creative/innovative is their contribution?
- How instrumental was the individual(s) in setting up and leading with their contribution?
- How much has the individual(s) gone above and beyond with their contribution?
- To what extent has the individual(s) brought about measurable change as a result of their contribution?
- How much has the individual(s) demonstrated successful collaboration with others?
