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Neonatal Neurodevelopmental Follow Up

- * Neurodevelopmental follow up relies on the expertise and research of many professionals
 - * Neonatology, Community paediatrics, Opthalmology, Physiotherapy, OT, Psychology, SALT, Audiology, Psychiatry
 - * We're not all experts in all fields!
- * 2 year follow-up: local /regional level
- * National and international variation in practice
- * Wealth of literature



What do we know?

- * Data from a wide range of studies show:
 - * Differences between preterm and term infants
 - cognitive functioning
 - * neuromotor impairment
 - sensory impairment
 - * behaviour (ADD, ASD)
 - * health status
 - * Assessment in later childhood can identify more subtle problems than those identifiable at two years
 - * school performance





Follow up happens in different ways

- * Formal assessment
 - variety of tools available
 - * timing / age
- * Supporting development
 - * Neuromotor supporting development and function
 - * Sensory assessing sensory development and promoting optimal environment
 - * Neurobehavioural working with families
 - * Speech & Language
 - Liaising with education (usually preschool)
- Supporting family involvement (links with FICare)





Annual Study day

- * Multi-professional study day aimed at exploring a range of topics related to the neurodevelopmental follow-up and outcomes of premature and sick new born babies.
- * Professionals involved in the care of babies in neonatal units and /or their long-term management and follow-up.
