PERCENTAGE OF DETAINEES WITH LEGAL REPRESENTATION		
51% of detainees interviewed had a legal representative at the time of the survey	n=68	51%
<ul> <li>Of these 32% of detainees with a legal representative were using a private (fee-paying) solicitor</li> </ul>	n=22	32%
And 68% of detainees with a legal representative were using a legal aid solicitor	n=46	68%
49% of detainees interviewed had no legal representative at the time of the survey (though they may have had a representative at a previous point in their detention).	n=66	49%
19% of the sample had <u>never</u> had a legal representative while in detention	n=25	19%
AWARENESS OF THE DDA SCHEME		
53% of detainees interviewed were aware of the DDA scheme	N=71	53%
<ul> <li>Of those who were aware of the scheme 61% had made a DDA appointment with the contracted advice provider</li> </ul>	N=43	61%
<ul> <li>14% of those who had made a DDA appointment were then taken on by the contracted advice provider</li> </ul>	N=10	14%
Only 8% of the entire sample of 134 interviewed detainees were taken on as DDA clients		
47% of detainees were unaware of the DDA scheme	N=63	47%
LOSING A LEGAL REP AS A RESULT OF TRANSFER BETWEEN IRCS		
23% of detainees interviewed had lost their legal representative on one or more occasion as the result of a transfer between IRCs	N=31	23%
IMMIGRATION ADVICE IN PRISON		
60% of detainees came to detention from prison (CCD cases)	N=81	60%
<ul> <li>Of these, 22% had an immigration legal advisor while they were in prison</li> <li>78% of detainees who had been foreign national prisoners had no immigration legal advice while they were in prison</li> </ul>	N=18	22%
FORMER RMJ CLIENTS		
16% of detainees interviewed had been clients of RMJ when they closed down in June 2010	N=21	16%
