



THE POWER OF EDUCATION, AS TOLD BY GRANDMA

Born and raised in a poor household with a single mother, life for Abigail was really hard. "Our mother could not afford to get us basic things, sometimes including education, shelter and food."

When her mother passed away, Abigail's old and unemployed grandmother took her in and tried to get her into school (BISO) as opposed to marrying her off - as is common in some Zambian cultures.

Her grandmother narrates in Bemba, "*Nalefwaya fye abeshikulu bandi kuti basembillile, iyi eyalifye inshila iyakupwisha ubuchushi twalepitamo. Nale umfwa fye, nomba lelo nimbona*" (I wanted my grandchildren to get an education, this was the only way to save them from further poverty. I only used to hear about it but now I have seen it myself; The power of education and how it can transform lives").
