PPC taster day for HCA's

- Facilitated by Tara Kerr-Elliott (tara.kerr-elliott@gosh.nhs.uk)
- For **HCA's** (plus support workers , play specialists etc)
- Up to 40
- Started in 2016
- One day study day; currently runs 2-3/ year
- **Content:** Introduction to PPC, Advance Care Planning, End-of-life and post-death care, communication, introduction to loss and grief, self-care.

Paediatric Palliative Care Foundation Programme

- Facilitated by Tara Kerr-Elliott (tara.kerr-elliott@gosh.nhs.uk)
- Commenced in 2014
- **Nurses** at Foundation level
- Runs twice a year ; 2 days taught (plus 1 day online)
- Up to 40 participants.
- **Content** : introduction to PPC, Symptom management, decision making, communication, end-of-life and post-death care, introduction to loss and grief

SIMULATION BASED EDUCATION

Currently 3 courses:

- Out of hospital extubation
- When a child dies
- Talking to families when death is a likely outcome



Out of hospital extubation simulation study day

- Multi-disciplinary faculty led by Tara Kerr-Elliott (tara.kerr-elliott@gosh.nhs.uk)
- **Inter-professional , inter-agency**
- 16 participants
- Started in 2016
- One day study day, currently runs twice / year
- **Content:** 4 teams of 4 (ITU, PC, transport and hospice / community) follow scenario facilitated by trained actors playing parents. Scenario is split into 4 sections – each with taught session , simulation and debrief (introducing withdrawal of ventilation, discussing preferred place of care, transport and extubation).

When a child dies – 2 day simulation study day

- Multi-disciplinary faculty (GOSH Bereavement, Chaplaincy, Palliative Care, and Mortuary Services)

led by Rachel Cooke (rachel.cooke@gosh.nhs.uk)

- **Interprofessional**
- 8 participants per course
- Commenced in 2017
- Two day study day; now running 3 times a year
- **Content:**

Taught sessions: Legal aspects of certification , Practical care of a patient when death is imminent, care after death , roles of the Coroner and Child Death Overview Panel , End of Life Conversations workshop

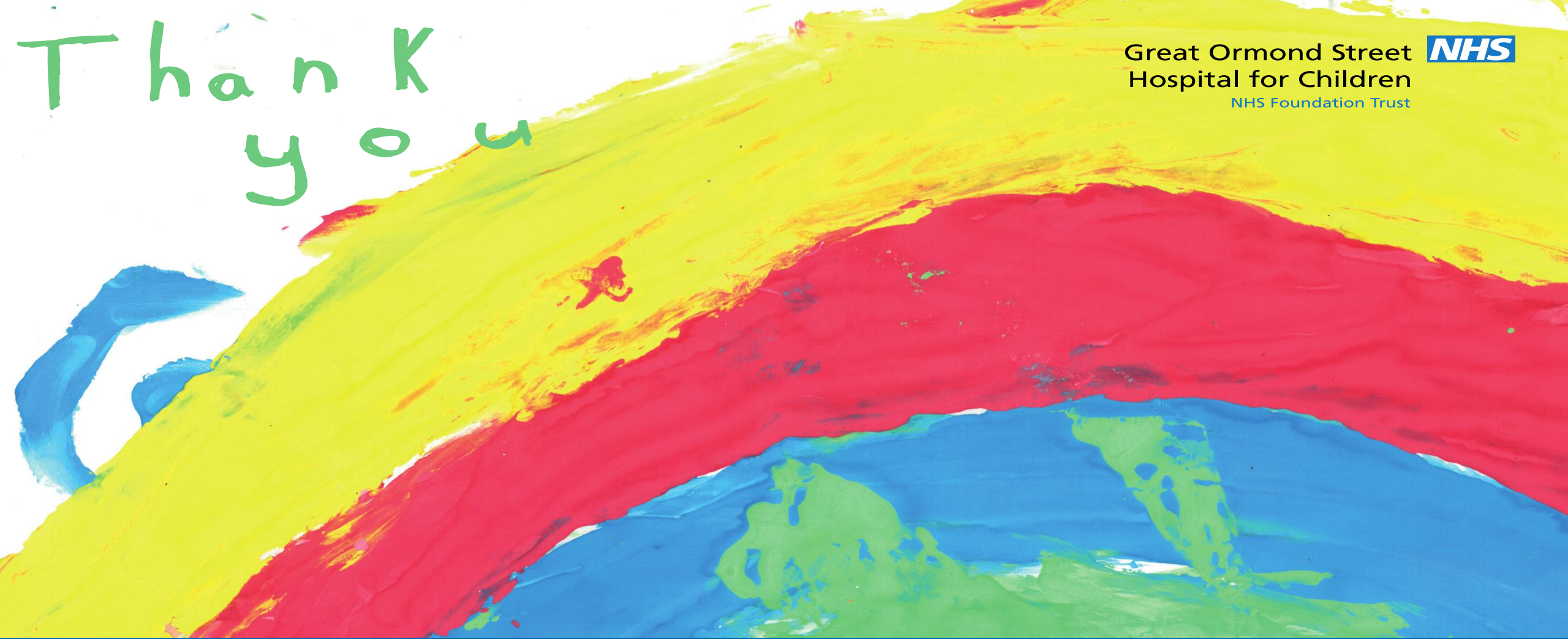
Simulated Scenarios involving: Care of parents, Effective communication strategies, spiritual, cultural, and religious considerations, transfer to the mortuary

Talking to families when death is a likely outcome

- Multi-professional faculty
(tara.kerr-elliott@gosh.nhs.uk)
- **Inter-professional**
- 16
- Commenced in January 2018; now running 5 times per year
- 1 day – includes two taught sessions and one simulation (with debrief) for each candidate in small groups
- Scenarios written for candidates own speciality
- **Content:** parallel planning, RESPECT, introducing palliative care, advance care planning

Non-medical prescribing in PPC

- Led by Julie Bayliss and Dr Linda Maynard (Julie.bayliss@gosh.nhs.uk)
- Aimed at all NMP (nurses, pharmacists, AHP's)
- 50-100 (depending on venue)
- Commenced in 2016
- One taught day per year
- **Content:** update in issues relating to NMP and then each day takes a theme (eg neurology / gastro / end-of-life symptoms)
