"Cancer Support Group Mallorca, run by Krista Hyer, provides support to people who are currently undergoing cancer treatments or have already gone through cancer treatments. They bring together these individuals to give support to one another," Helen told the Bulletin. "The money raised will be used towards renting space and providing taxi rides to and from treatments. Also to fund wigs, pillows or other items that some can't afford.

"Un Lazo en Movimiento (ULEM) run by Linda Breevaart, is an organisation whose goal is to promote a new funding mechanism for saving lives through voluntary contributions. These contributions are intended to fund projects to research for the fight against breast cancer and psychological and social support for patients."

No major event appears complete without Radio OneMallorca's, Richie Prior and Ayesha Wood, who not only promoted the evening on their breakfast show but also attended the event to run the raffle and auction in their normal professional and lively fashion! Among the items auctioned, three brave men offering to be slaves for a day.

The evening included an emotional presentation to honour Sue Burrows, a feisty courageous lady, who had used the time left to her before succumbing in her battle against cancer, to improve the lot for other sufferers in Majorca by creating a support structure around the island. After much deliberation her devoted friends asked a renowned Majorcan sculptor Jeroni Bosch to design a unique sculpture in memory of Sue to be presented to her husband Mike.
