Cancer group is working on new campaign of male cancers

MALLORCA'S Cancer Support Group is working tirelessly on a new campaign which highlights two male cancers that are becoming increasingly prevalent and need to be talked about openly, so that their symptoms are recognised and checked out as early as possible.

Pro-Test aims to educate the public about prostate and testicular cancers and the local Cancer Support Group has teamed up with

Ballboys, a British Charity, who will be attending the Magaluf Beach Rugby Tournament being held on Saturday May 2 and Sunday May 3.

The Pro-Test campaign are also inviting sports, tennis, rugby, football and cricket clubs to display the literature

and possibly allow one of the charity's representatives to give a 10 minute talk called 'Know your Balls.'

Testicular cancer usually affects younger men between the ages of 15 to 49. The most common symptom is a painless lump or swelling in the testicles, or a dull ache or feeling of heaviness in the scrotum. Prostate cancer typically targets men over the age of 50
