Financial Review

The charity's policy on reserves.

Our expectation is that funds raised should be expended as soon as possible on the objects of the Friends – the promotion of the worship, work and fabric of Coventry Cathedral. The nature of many projects and the policy requirements of the Cathedral mean that the funds raised will not necessarily be advanced on projects within each year. The sum of £30,000 is set aside in case of a sudden Cathedral financial emergency in the future. All funds will be used for our charitable objects over a reasonable time period.

The trustees have examined the Charity's requirements for reserves in the light of the main risks to the organisation. Our reserves are required for the working capital of the charity and to ensure our ability to maintain a service to life members.

During the year our priority has been to ensure that projects financed by the charity are carried out to a high standard and that they accord with the policy of the Cathedral Chapter. Each project is examined carefully to ensure that it falls within the definition of the charity's objects.

The charity's principal sources of funds.

In the year 2017 there was an income of £12,196 and expenditure of £17,748, a net outlay of £5,552. The net assets of the charity were £96,109, a reduction from £101,661 in the previous year. Income from subscriptions was £6,958 in 2017 augmented by Gift Aid in the sum of £1,096.

Our donations have contributed to the care of the Cathedral building and its ornaments. They have helped maintain public worship and have supported its ministry.

Funds have also been used to raise the profile of The Friends both inside and outside the Cathedral community.

How expenditure has supported the key objectives of the charity.

In 2017 grants of £14,506 were made to the Cathedral. In addition, the sum of £100 was given to Coventry's City of Culture 2021 bid, which succeeded and in which the Cathedral will play a significant part. The Cathedral Chapter is well advanced in the compilation of a comprehensive Development Plan for the whole Cathedral site, and the Friends are ready to play a part in the developments that arise from it.
