Objectives and activities

The objects of The Friends are to promote the restoration, maintenance, repair and improvement of the fabric, ornaments and furniture of the Cathedral Church of St Michael, Coventry and to maintain public worship and support the ministry of Coventry Cathedral within the diocese and internationally.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

Membership

We aim to maintain and grow our annual and life membership.

Communication

We communicate to members via newsletters, a web site, e-mail update and the weekly cathedral bulletin

Events

We promote a regular series of events to engage members with aspects of life at the Cathedral, for Friends to meet up and also a source of new members and fund raising

Funding

We make grants towards projects and activities that meet our agreed funding guidelines. At the beginning of each year, after Restricted, Designated and Annual Membership Funds have been deducted; half the remaining balance is made available to fund projects in that year. A 'Life Members Designated Fund' ensures Life Members can be serviced in the future.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Membership

We are steadily recruiting new members and have achieved a net increase in full members during 2013 of 29, a 6% increase.

The number of complimentary 'Associate Members', who are 'Cathedral Liaison Officers' based in parishes in the Diocese, has declined.

Financial Review

•	The charity's policy on reserves	There is a basic expectation that funds raised should be expended as soon as possible on the objects of The Friends – the promotion of the worship, work and fabric of Coventry Cathedral. However, due to the nature of various projects and the requirements of the Cathedral, funds raised may not be fully expended each year, but will be used for charitable purposes over a reasonable timescale.		
		The trustees have examined the Charity's requirements for reserves in the light of the main risks to the organisation. The reserves are needed to meet the working capital of the charity and to ensure that we can maintain a service to life members.		
		During the year our priority has been to ensure that projects are carried out to a high standard. Council has been prudent only to support projects with a genuine opportunity to further its objects.		
•	The charity's principal	In the year 2013 there was an excess of income over expenditure of £11,603.		
sources of funds		As a result, the total net assets increased by £11,603 (20%) from £56,041 in 2012 to £67,644 in 2013.		
		Income from subscriptions was £5,947 in 2013, an increase of £505 on 2012. Encouragingly income realised from Gift Aid increased from £1,929 in 2012, to £2,333 in 2013 (up 21%).		
		Net income from the Friends activities and sales totalled £3,640 compared with \pounds 17,856 in 2012. The latter figure was inflated because the Friends were the financial 'vehicle', for the receipt and disbursement of grants, for the 'Journey into the Light Exhibition'.		
		Additional income totalling £1875 was derived from concerts given by 'Amici' which is to be used for Liturgical or Music use only.		
		At the AGM in 2013 a 12 months Archbishop's Challenge was launched to increase Membership and Prayer Support and to raise funds for a major project in 2014 to mark the Friend's 80th Anniversary.		
		Donations have contributed to the care of The Cathedral building and its ornaments, helped maintain its public worship and supported its ministry.		
		Funds have also been used to raise the profile of The Friends both inside and outside the Cathedral Community
