Events

We promote a regular series of events to engage members with aspects of life at the Cathedral, for Friends to meet up and also to provide a source of new members and fund raising

Funding

We make grants towards projects and activities that meet our agreed funding guidelines. At the beginning of each year, after Restricted, Designated and Annual Membership Funds have been deducted; up to half the remaining balance is made available to fund projects in that year.

We are steadily recruiting new members and have achieved a net increase in full members during 2014 of 46, which is a 9% uplift.

* At end of 2014, after consultation with the Bishop and the Dean, it was decided that the Cathedral Liaison Officers should be renamed Cathedral Parish Partners. They will not, in future, be offered free Associate Membership of the Friends, as their role is considered to be separate from, but complementary to, the work of the Friends.

Financial Review

•	The charity's policy on reserves	There is a basic expectation that funds raised should be expended as soon as possible on the objects of The Friends – the promotion of the worship, work and fabric of Coventry Cathedral. However, due to the nature of various projects and the requirements of the Cathedral, funds raised may not be fully expended each year, but will be used for charitable purposes over a reasonable timescale.
		The trustees have examined the Charity's requirements for reserves in the light of the main risks to the organisation. The reserves are needed to meet the working capital of the charity and to ensure that we can maintain a service to life members.
		During the year our priority has been to ensure that projects are carried out to a high standard. Council has been prudent only to support projects with a genuine opportunity to further its objects.
•	The charity's principal	In the year 2014 there was an excess of income over expenditure of $\pounds 15, 145$.
	sources of funds	As a result, the total net assets increased by £15,145 (22%) from £67,644 in 2013 to £82,789 in 2014.
		Income from subscriptions was £7,819 in 2014, an increase of £1,872 (up 31%) on 2013. Encouragingly income realised from Gift Aid increased from £2,333 in 2013, to £9,750 in 2014 (up 318%).
		Net income from the Friends activities and sales totalled $\pounds 17,328$ compared with $\pounds 5,515$ in 2012. The 80th Anniversary Dinner raised $\pounds 514$ and the Prom for All Concert realised $\pounds 5,338$
		Additional income totalling £1890 was derived from concerts given by 'Amici', which is to be used for Liturgical or Music use only.
		The Archbishop's Challenge was launched in 2013, to increase both Membership and Prayer Support and to raise funds for the Cathedral, to mark the Friend's 80th Anniversary. Overall, it raised £53,000 (with Gift Aid) of which £39,939 (including an exceptional gift of £25,000, with Gift Aid) was given in 2014.
		Donations have contributed to the care of The Cathedral building and its ornaments, helped maintain its public worship and supported its ministry.
		Funds have also been used to raise the profile of The Friends both inside and outside the Cathedral Community

1.1 Basis of accounting
