Publication presenting the results of the most recent climate report of the United Nations, published in March 2020.

<u>Tree planting 'has mind-blowing potential' to tackle climate crisis</u> (Guardian, 2019) Outlines recent research findings on the potential of tree planting to act as a first step in curbing climate change.

Family Affair: Coronavirus and the Climate Crisis (Think Global Health, 2020)

Uses the example of Cyclone Amphan in May 2020 to highlight how storms and other extreme weather events will increasingly interact with other health threats due to climate change.

<u>Kenya Is Trying to End Child Marriage. But Climate Change Is Putting More Young</u> <u>Girls at Risk</u> (Time, 2020)

Explains the association between economic hardship placed on rural families in Kenya through climate change and increasing rates of child marriage, thus illustrating that the dangers of climate change are not evenly distributed among populations but tend to fall on those in vulnerable positions.

Climate Change and the Rise of Poverty (UNDP, 2018)

Highlights the necessity of improving resilience of those living in or close to poverty against climate change by providing them with social protection schemes. .
