I undertake independent assessments in a variety of areas and write reports for the courts relating to children and parents or other family members.

RELEVANT EXPERIENCE

I am director and practice lead at FocusPsychology, which provides schools (across the age range) and alternative or specialist provisions (for SEMH, Learning Disability or Autistic Spectrum Condition) with embedded psychological services, specifically to develop their Pastoral Care and SEND offering. I work with individual children and young people, their families and the school practitioners that teach and support them. This work requires the ability to evaluate information independently and without bias.

I understand the developmental needs of children and have carried out assessments of vulnerable youngsters and their families at risk of care proceedings or in the care of the local authority. A particular area of expertise is the influence of culture on constructs around parenting and child development. Another area of specific interest is the support of foster carers and of families following adoption.

I liaise closely with other professionals in order to develop an accurate picture of client and family needs and to recommend appropriate strategies to alleviate the difficulties identified. I have experience of providing assessments of adults, as well as children.

Work encompasses all areas of cognitive, developmental and educational, as well as social psychology, covering themes such as attachment and loss, the emotional effects of neglect and abuse, social learning, self-efficacy and resilience, emotional intelligence, personal constructs, systemic factors, personality and identity, as well as motivation and learning ability/capacity.

I am a fluent speaker of the Punjabi language but also have experience of working with interpreters when assessing families with English as an additional language. My workload includes preparing reports for the family courts, schools, Local Authorities and individuals, working with and advising parents and taking part in multi-professional meetings.

In addition, I carry out training in areas such as Developmental Trauma and Attachment, Autistic Spectrum Condition, Social Emotional Mental Health and Working with Families of Vulnerable Children.

I offer therapy (using a variety of techniques) to young people under stress and suffering from anxiety and depression.

I have an in-depth knowledge of psychological methodologies and approaches in child and developmental psychology.

I have lectured in aspects of child and developmental psychology for Sheffield Hallam University, the University of Sheffield and the University of Nottingham. This included lecturing to trainee Psychologists on the creative use of methodologies in child and social psychology when working with vulnerable (or at risk) youngsters and their families.

Other modules I taught included working with children with special educational needs and the identification, assessment and alleviation of Dyslexia.

I have conducted academic research to inform new initiatives and develop knowledge and practice within the field of psychology, including studying for a Doctorate (my main thesis explored ethnicity and acculturation)

I regularly attend courses and training relevant to my work. I act as a Supervisor to other Educational Psychologists in practice.
