Constitution

The charity is registered with the charity commission (no 1073247) and is constituted by deed dated 23 October 1998 (as amended 19th December 2017) and is governed by the terms of that deed.

Trustees

Trustees are shown on p2 of this document.

Objects

Our vision is a world where people with learning disabilities are treated without prejudice, and are able to have choice and control over their own lives.

Our mission is three fold:

- 1. To make sure that there is independent support for people with learning disabilities in Oxfordshire to have their say and to claim their rights
- 2. To make sure that the views of people with learning disabilities are taken seriously by both professionals in the services they use and the wider public
- 3. To "Power Up" their lives so they can make a positive contribution to society.

Review of the year

This year has been a year of great growth for My Life My Choice. We are delighted to have started a brand new project, Gig Buddies which runs monthly events and pairs up volunteers with beneficiaries to reduce loneliness. This project is the start of a great partnership with other local charities Restore, Age UK Oxfordshire and Aspire.

We are also pleased to have been awarded funding by the Peoples Health Trust to start a new walking club, as well as £261,135 from the National Lottery Community Fund to grow and develop our Travel Buddy project over the next 3 years. As part of this growth, we have moved to new and bigger offices to accommodate our growing staff team and extra work. We are very happy in our new accessible home on Watlington Road, Oxford where we have a designated training room, and champions room for members to meet socially and to plan campaigns.

We were thrilled to be accredited as one of the first 10 Oxford Living Wage Employers for paying all members and staff at least £10.02 per hour. Our trustee, Gina, attended the celebration event at the Oxford Town Hall with the Lord Mayor and the Council's Living Wage Champion, Councillor Martyn Rush.

Finally, we are looking forward to the next year where we have lots of big changes in store. We are excited to develop the campaigns side of our work through a Parliament. We are also delighted to be a founding member of the National Self-Advocacy Coalition. We will be working with fellow self-advocacy organisations to create a united voice of people with learning disabilities in the UK and enact positive changes.

Reserves Policy

The trustees have established a reserves policy whereby the unrestricted funds (and already accrued contingency reserve brought forward) not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets held by the charity should be between 3 and 6 months. Based on the last three years expenditure and the projected expenditure in 2019/20, the minimum target for 3 months is £80,684 with a maximum target not exceeding £161,367.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Charity Law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law).

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the charity's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011. They are responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

1. ORGANISATION STATUS

My Life My Choice is a charity constituted by deed dated 23 October 1998 (as amended 19th December 2017) and governed by the terms of that deed.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS102.

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards and the requirements of the Statements of Recommended Practice 2015 (SORP 2015), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities', issued by the Charities Commission and the Companies Act 2006, with FRS102, update bulletin 1.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the donor or trust deed.

Income

All income is included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Investment income and interest receivable

Income from investments and deposit interest is included in the statement of financial activities when it becomes receivable. Investment income is included gross of recoverable taxation.

Expenditure

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure represents amounts invoiced, including value added tax.

Fixed assets

Fixed assets (excluding investments) are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. All assets costing £150 or more are capitalised and valued at historical cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Office furniture - 20% straight line

Computer equipment - 33% straight line
