## Classes

1. A collection of 6 kinds of vegetables, one of each kind, to be laid flat (Staging allowed).
2. Celery one dish of two heads.
3. Cauliflowers, one dish of two.
4. Onions, one dish of five, each onion to weigh a minimum of 1kg, but not more than 1.5kg (Staging allowed)
5. Tomatoes medium, one dish of Nine (Plate provided)
6. Mini-Collection, three kinds of vegetables, two of each kind (Staging allowed).
7. Carrots – stump rooted, one dish of three
8. Potatoes – White, one dish of five, (Plate provided)
9. Beetroot – Globe, one dish of five (Plate provided)
10. Onions, one dish of five, each onion must not weigh more than 250gms (Plate provided).
11. Potatoes-Coloured, one dish of five (Plate provided)
12. Shallots-Large exhibition, one dish of twelve (plate provided)
13. Parsnips, one dish of three.
14. Carrots-Long pointed, one dish of three.
15. Leeks-blanch, one dish of three
16. Tap Root Collection, one of each of three from the following:
  - Carrot – Long pointed
  - Carrot – stump rooted
  - Parsnip
  - Beetroot – Long
  - Beetroot – Globe
17. Onions-Large exhibition, one dish of three (Staging allowed)
18. Beans French, one dish of nine pods
19. Beans Runner, one dish of nine pods
20. Cucumber, one dish of two
21. Marrow table, one dish of two
22. Shallots pickling, one dish of twelve (each shallot must pass cleanly through a 30mm ring)
23. Cabbage, one dish of two
24. Pot Leeks, one dish of two

## SCHEDULE OF RULES

1. All exhibitors must be current members of the National Vegetable Society or one member from an affiliated society.
2. Entry is restricted to one exhibitor, per household, per class and must be the property of, and grown by, the exhibitor.
3. The show organisers cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage whatsoever, however all reasonable care will be taken.
4. Judging will be to the 2018 NVS Judges & Exhibitors Guide plus amendments or additions.
5. All exhibits must be named using NVS variety card only (Cards provided).
6. Onions and shallots will be tied with Natural raffia only.
7. The base of each onion staged must not be more than 150mm above the table.
8. All tap root vegetables shall have their tops trimmed to approximately 75mm.
9. Only plates provided by the Society shall be used.
10. No other staging except the use of black cloth to be used, except where stated in the schedule.
11. The handling of exhibits once staged, or after judging, is strictly forbidden.
12. Exhibits must not be removed until the lifting time of 4:30 pm on Sunday 15th September.
13. Only Judges, Show Officials and Stewards will be allowed in the show hall during judging.
14. The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry, and in the event of any such refusal, an explanation will be given.
15. Entry to both the classes and the show is free to exhibitors.
16. At the end of the show, any surplus vegetables will be sold to help defray expenses.

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
