Appendix B

Game: Choose your team

Reflection

How did everyone react when Jesus asked them to join him?

Why do you think they did this?

How do you think they felt?

Why do you think Jesus chose them?

How do you feel when you're picked for a team?

The bible doesn't tell us why Jesus chose these people to be his followers, his friends. They had different jobs, different personalities and came from different situations. They didn't hesitate to give up what they were doing and go with him. They must have seen that he was someone very special and they wanted to be with him. They were excited by the thought of new experiences and adventures with him.

Think about when you first became friends with one of your friends. Where were you? What were you doing? You were probably playing together or talking together and you just clicked and knew you would be great friends. It wasn't that they were the best at something, it was because there was a good feeling between you. How did you feel? You were probably happy and excited about the fun you would have together and the adventures and experiences you would share. It's a great feeling.

It's good to be open to new friendships, like the disciples were with Jesus, and to take opportunities to make new friends: when someone joins your class, when you join a new activity group. Friendship isn't based on being the best or even being really good at something. A good friendship, like a good team, is not about skills, but about trust and love between you. Friendship is a wonderful gift to give or to be given.


