

Your Will tells people two very important things:

- ① Who should have your Estate (your money, property and possessions) when you die
- Who will be in charge of organising your estate and following the instructions you leave in your Will – this person is called your 'executor'.

Here are seven reasons why it's important to make a Will:

- A Will is the only way to guarantee everything you own goes to the people and causes you care about
- ② A Will makes it much easier for your family or friends to sort everything out when you die – without a Will the process can be more time consuming and stressful
- ③ A Will also enables you to preserve assets for beneficiaries, by making specific gifts to individuals. These can range from items of jewellery to sums of cash or property and/or business interests
- Inheritance Tax a Will can help reduce the amount of Inheritance Tax that may be payable on the value of the property and money you leave behind.
- (5) Writing a Will is especially important if you have children or other family who depend on you financially, or if you want to leave something to people outside your immediate family. The absence of a Will can sometimes lead to family disputes. Leaving a Will should remove any doubt about who you want to leave your estate to.
- 6 A Will allows you to appoint Guardians to look after your children if they are under 18.
- You can also use your Will to tell people about any other wishes you have, like instructions for your burial or cremation
