Councillor Community Budgets

Councillor Community Budgets are an Oxfordshire County Council grant scheme developed within the Big Society framework. The scheme is designed to take advantage of councillors' local knowledge.

Each county councillor has a £10,000 councillor community budget for 2013/14 to support projects that matter most to their local community. It is up to councillors to decide how to spend their budgets, reflecting the principle that councillors are best placed to recognise and meet the needs of their local communities.

To apply for funding you must be a not-for-profit organisation looking to meet a recognised need in your community. Eligible organisations are able to submit requests for funding by completing a funding request form and passing it to their local councillor for their approval.

Applications will close in early 2014.

If you are interested in applying for funding then it is strongly recommended that you contact your local county councillor (Susanna Pressel - contact details on the back page) to check your proposal's feasibility.

Save WEST WAY Say NO to the Doric Proposals



Plans for redevelopment of Botley by Doric Properties would destroy our neighbourhood centre – including Elms Parade and Field House – and replace it with a 7-storey complex with 600 student homes, underground car park, giant supermarket and 6-screen cinema. Local reaction has been strongly negative. Doric now say some changes are 'likely' but will not say what might happen.

BOTLEY wants BETTER not BIGGER!

Are you aware of the huge changes being proposed for the centre of Botley? The plans proposed by London-based Doric Properties involve destruction of the existing buildings, fewer small shops, meaning Botley would lose many of the existing local shops and services we rely on Elms Parade, Field House senior citizens' homes and St Peter and St Paul's vicarage would all be demolished (potentially via compulsory purchase if the landowners don't want to sell). Doric are expected to apply for planning permission for these developments in December. Many local people think the scale of this development is completely inappropriate for a residential area like ours. It seems to be more about making money for the developers and Vale Council than about improving Botley for the benefit of those who live, shop and work here.

Not a done deal!

But it's not a done deal! If we as a community do not want this development, we can and will fight it. There are many examples of communities successfully stopping such developments. West Way Community Concern is campaigning to get local people's voices heard. We support the regeneration of Botley, providing it is in keeping with the area and puts local needs first. The smaller-scale plans put forward by Vale last year would be a good starting point.

We will be presenting a petition to a Vale Council meeting in December to show the strength of local feeling.

What can I do?

If you don't think this development is right for Botley, it's crucial to make your voice heard.

- Write or email to Vale District Council officers, other local councillors, and Nicola Blackwood MP (addresses below)
- Write to the Oxford Mail or Oxford Times
- Sign the petition even if you have signed one previously. They are in many of the Botley shops and cafes as well as in your community centre.
- Ask your friends and neighbours to sign the petition: we can supply you with copies.
- Be ready to object to the planning application when Doric submits it in December.
- To sign up for updates or offer help, contact us by email or via Café Aloha.
- Doric Properties have Facebook and Twitter pages why not comment there?
- Donate to our appeal: funds are needed to co-ordinate the campaign. Any left-over money will be given to community projects. Cheques payable to West Way Community Concern can be left at Café Aloha, or see our website for how to donate electronically.

Para's 2013 Superb South Indian Fairly Traded Black and White Peppercorns!

This outstanding pepper comes from the Wynad Hills in Kerala. Grown to organic standards and sun dried, the corns are hand-picked only once they are ripe, unlike most systems which pick every corn in one go. The plantation employs some 90 people who in turn feed and support some 400 dependants.

I don't make any money out of selling the pepper: I simply want other people to enjoy it and to help secure the livelihoods of those who depend on the pepper.

Each vacuum packed 75g (2.64oz) bag costs £2.50 and has a shelf-life of 3+ years
