Monthly Updates on community notice boards by 'Supersaver' and 'Cartridge World'

WOCA has faced a problem at the centre that has been 'bugging' us for many years. The problem is that we do not have the space for buggies to be safely stored indoors. At busy times there are upwards of 40 buggies in the building, blocking fire exits and escape routes, which presents a serious safety issue for centre users.

From April 15th the Community Centre will be a buggy-free building!

More space for the kids to play!

There will be a buggy park to the rear of the building by the café.

If you're worried about security then why not lock it up with a bike lock?

Activities for young children and their parents at the centre, and the provision of the café, are excellent ways for people to connect and get to know the place. After consulting with parents of children and organisers of children's activities at the centre, and weighing up the options, WOCA has reluctantly decide that a ban on buggies, with the provision of a buggy park, is the most practical solution. WOCA was particularly influenced by the experience of Elms Road Children Centre. A ban was introduced there some time ago for similar reasons, and has proven to be effective, without a decline in use. WOCA will be taking a sympathetic approach to the ban, and particular consideration will be made for situations such as when people arrive with sleeping babies.

West Way Community Concern has been set up by a group of local residents who feel that the community served by the West Way shopping centre needs an independent voice to represent its needs and wishes to the developers (Doric Properties) and the planning authority (The Vale of White Horse). Since forming in February, we have

- Been welcomed by the North Hinksey Parish Council as a representative voice for the community that uses West Way facilities.
- Set up an email address to contact us westwayconcern@gmail.com
- Set up a website which we will keep updated as the project progresses at www.westwayconcern.wordpress.com
- Designed a survey which will be available at the end of March to the community of West Way users.

The survey is the most important step we have taken. You can collect survey forms from one of many shops in West Way who are displaying our poster in their window. Completed forms can be dropped off at these shops or at the Botley Library. Alternatively, you can fill in the survey on-line at: www.surveymonkey.com/s/west_way_community

It is really important that as many of those as possible who use the shopping centre contribute to this survey. It will be used to show the strength of community feeling about the various elements of the proposed development. This will give us strong backing to influence the outcome of the consultation process.

We plan to hold a public meeting at Saints Peter & Paul Church on Wednesday 22 May at 7.00pm. Also, on Saturday 13 April, we are holding an open day at Seacourt Hall from 10am to 1pm when you can come along, let us know more about your thoughts on the development and ask any questions about how we plan to present your views.





Bring goods from 10.30am to 11.30 am only, and take goods anytime from 10.30am. The event aims to help reduce, re-use and recycle. By reducing the amount of goods we buy, swapping them when we no longer need them and recycling what's left over, we reduce the amount of stuff going to landfill, reduce our community's carbon emissions and save money. There will be competitions and seed swaps, and activities for kids such as energy and waste-themed gadgets to try out on the Green Schools Bus. We will hold free, private energy advice surgeries to deal with householders' and tenants' specific energy enquiries about their homes. Para's 2012 Superb South Indian Fairly Traded Black and White Peppercorns have arrived!

This outstanding pepper comes from the Wynad Hills in Kerala. Grown to organic standards and sun dried, the corns are hand-picked only once they are ripe, unlike most systems which pick every corn in one go. The plantation employs some 90 people, who in turn feed and support some 400 dependants.

Each vacuum packed 75g (2.64oz) bag costs £2.50 and has a shelf-life of 3+ years
