

Free thermal image of your house

Help reduce your heat loss and save money on your heating bills by seeing where your house is losing heat, then find out what you can do about it. LCWO will be photographing houses with a thermal imaging camera at the end of January. If you're interested in having a free thermal image taken, please contact us. Numbers limited so apply now.

Don't miss out on a government grant to make your home warmer and healthier

Eligible households should apply now for a government grant towards better home insulation or heating as the scheme will end soon. Grants of up to £3,500, which you don't have to pay back, are available through the government's Warm Front Scheme. The money can pay for:

- Insulation loft, cavity wall or hot water tank
- Draught-proofing
- Gas, electric or oil heating
- Converting your solid-fuel open fire to a glass-fronted fire
- Replacing your heating system with an oil or alternative technology system — the grant limit for this is £6,000

To be eligible for a grant both you and the property need to qualify. If you own your own home or rent it from a private landlord and you or your spouse are in receipt of certain benefits you could be eligible if your property is poorly insulated and/or does not have a working central heating system. If you rent your home you will need the owner's permission to have the work done.

The Warm Front Scheme provides advice, funding and even organises for all the work to be done. Several households from West Oxford have already qualified for the grant. Para's 2012 Superb South Indian Fairly Traded Black and White Peppercorns have arrived!

This outstanding pepper comes from the Wynad Hills, in Kerala, South India, an area with an established reputation for producing fine quality pepper. It is grown to organic standards and sun dried. The corns are handpicked only once they are ripe, unlike most harvesting systems which simply pick every corn at one go.

Vacuum packed in 75 gram (2.64 oz) bags with a shelf life of 3+ years. £2.50p a packet.


I don't make any money out of selling the pepper, my involvement is simple and two-fold: I want other people to enjoy this wonderful pepper and I want to help secure the livelihoods of those who depend on the pepper. The plantation employs some 90 locals (mainly tribal people who remain at the bottom of the caste system), who in turn feed and support some 400 dependants.
