It communicates these to the local councils, the police and other authorities. People have identified the following major concerns: congested and dangerous roads, the granting of planning permissions that do not take local views into account, major changes proposed for the Elms Parade complex, and crime and community safety. We have been encouraged by the local Councils to apply for an Active Communities grant to establish a network of Community Guardians across West Oxford. The Guardians would act as a link between WOM and their own patch. They would listen to what local people's concerns, share information on any planning applications or changes coming up and work as part of West Oxford Matters to put local people at the heart of shaping our community, ensuring everyone has the opportunity to have their say. The Guardians would receive support and mentoring, and each Guardian would have a small budget to spend in their area.
