### New Scheme to Reduce Local Plastic Bag Use



Low Carbon West Oxford's survey of local shoppers found that people support plastic bag reduction and

generally use their own bags when shopping, but sometimes forget to take a bag with them, or buy more than they can carry. LCWO have therefore supplied local shops with reusable cotton bags to lend to local people rather than offering them a plastic bag. The bags can then be returned to participating shops on a subsequent visit, and they will be laundered by LCWO.

So next time you shop in Eggs Eggcetera, Supersava, Woodlands Pharmacy and Warlands Bike Shop, but have not got your own bag, just ask Your city councillors are: to borrow one!
