

# **News from the Neighbourhood Police Team**

Nine of the neighbourhood's licensed premises were subjected to alcohol test purchasing operations early in August, with the help of underage volunteers, special constables and licensing staff. All premises passed accept one. This is a marked improvement on previous operations and is a reflection of all the hard work by the team and licensing dept. to raise awareness of premises supervisors on how to avoid underage sales. If you have any concerns about a licensed premises please contact us.

A great deal of police resources and time is being spent investigating disturbing reports of the targeting of a popular local business. These reports are undoubtedly having a significant impact on the local community members, many of whom are showing great support for the proprietor. In addition to the detailed investigations being conducted by the officers in the case, there is ongoing forensic work and both plain clothes and uniformed reassurance patrols.

Crime reduction advice: Invest in window and door locks and call for any crime reduction advice on 0845 8 505 505. At present we are asking local bicycle shops to participate in marking bikes in store and issuing security advice for bike owners to assist with reducing crime.
