2 Big "Switch Ons"

On Thursday 24th June 2010, West Oxford Community Renewables Ltd (WOCR) unveiled their 100 kW solar panel array on the roof of Matthew Arnold School and their 50kw solar panel array on the roof of Aldi's West Oxford store.

The electricity generated by the solar panels will be sold to the school and the store respectively. The profits will be passed on to a community led environmental group, Low Carbon West Oxford – to reinvest in future green initiatives. Together the roofs will generate approximately £50,000 for reinvestment in local community environmental activities as a result of the Government's feed-in tariff scheme.

Largest school array of solar panels in the UK

The 100 kW array on Matthew Arnold School roof is expected to generate the energy equivalent to that needed to run 30 average UK households per year and the 50 kW array on Aldi roof is expected to generate the energy equivalent to that needed to run 15 average UK households per year.
